

Easy Academia – AEA 2021 Guidelines

During the conference, ALL sessions can be accessed by logging in to the CONFERENCE PLATFORM “EasyAcademia”. You may login to the conference platform at any time before the conference to view the program. Links will be activated on the day of the conference.

Most of you have already used the platform during the abstract submission process, so you already have a username and a password to login - make sure you have those available.

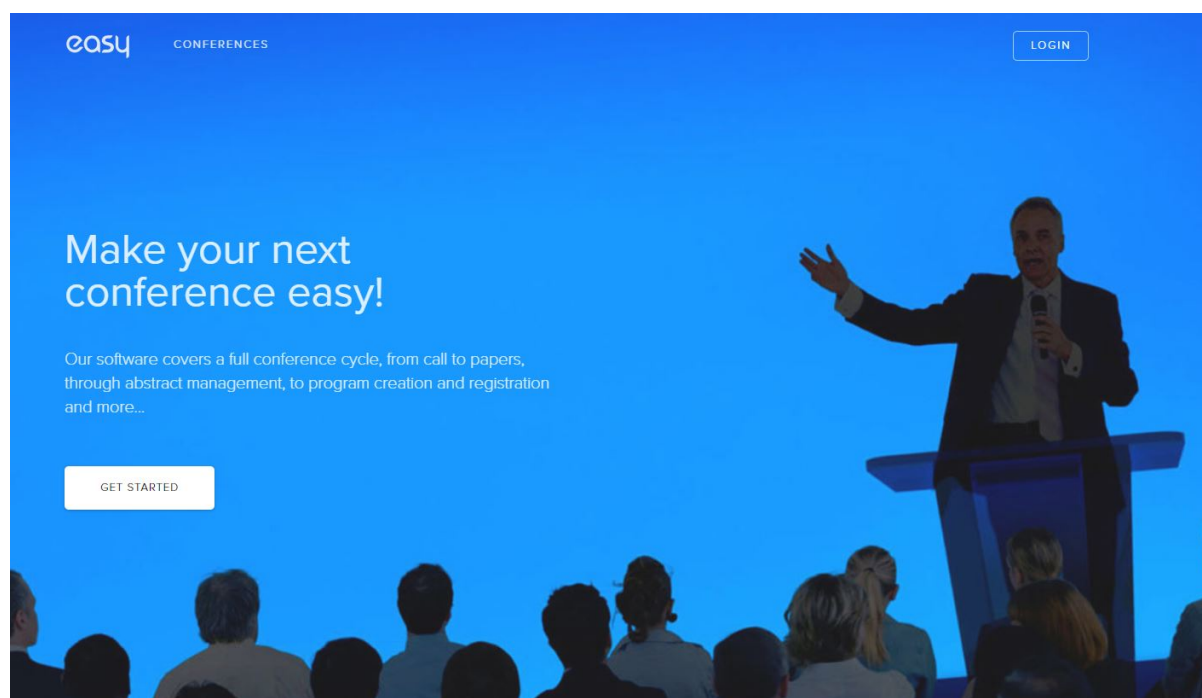

Create account

First, you will need to set up an account. Go to www.easyacademia.org and click on the “Get Started” button.

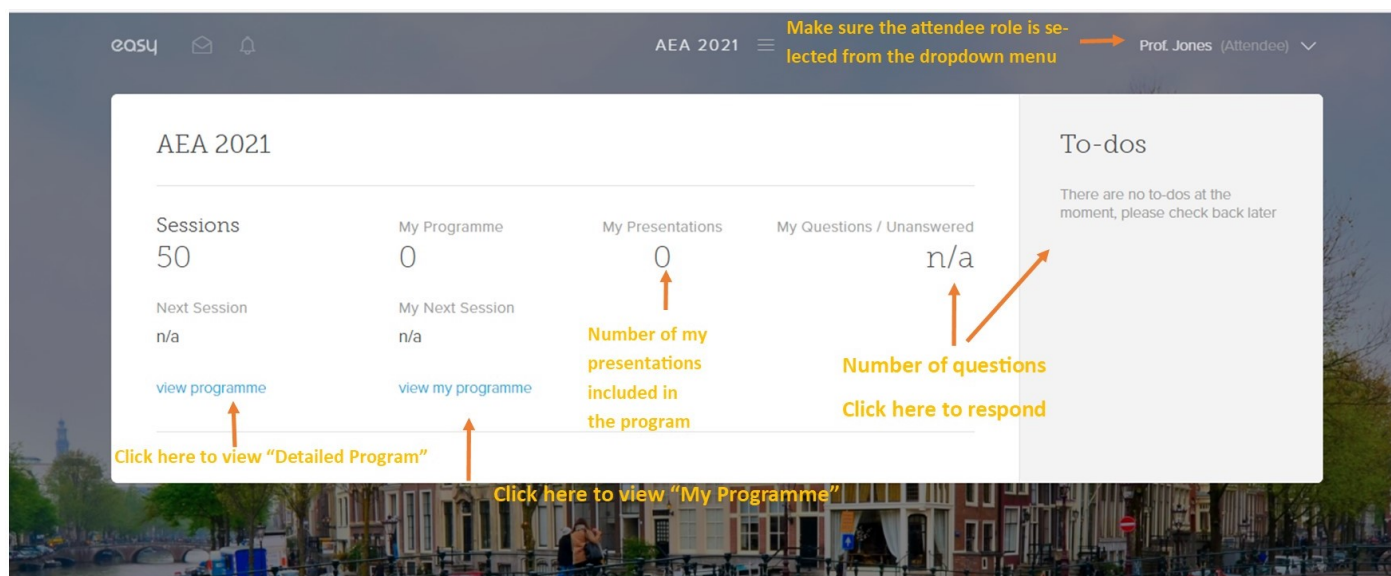
Follow the on-screen instructions and complete the form and click on “Create Account”.

Now, you will receive an email with the activation code. Use the link provided in the email to verify your account.

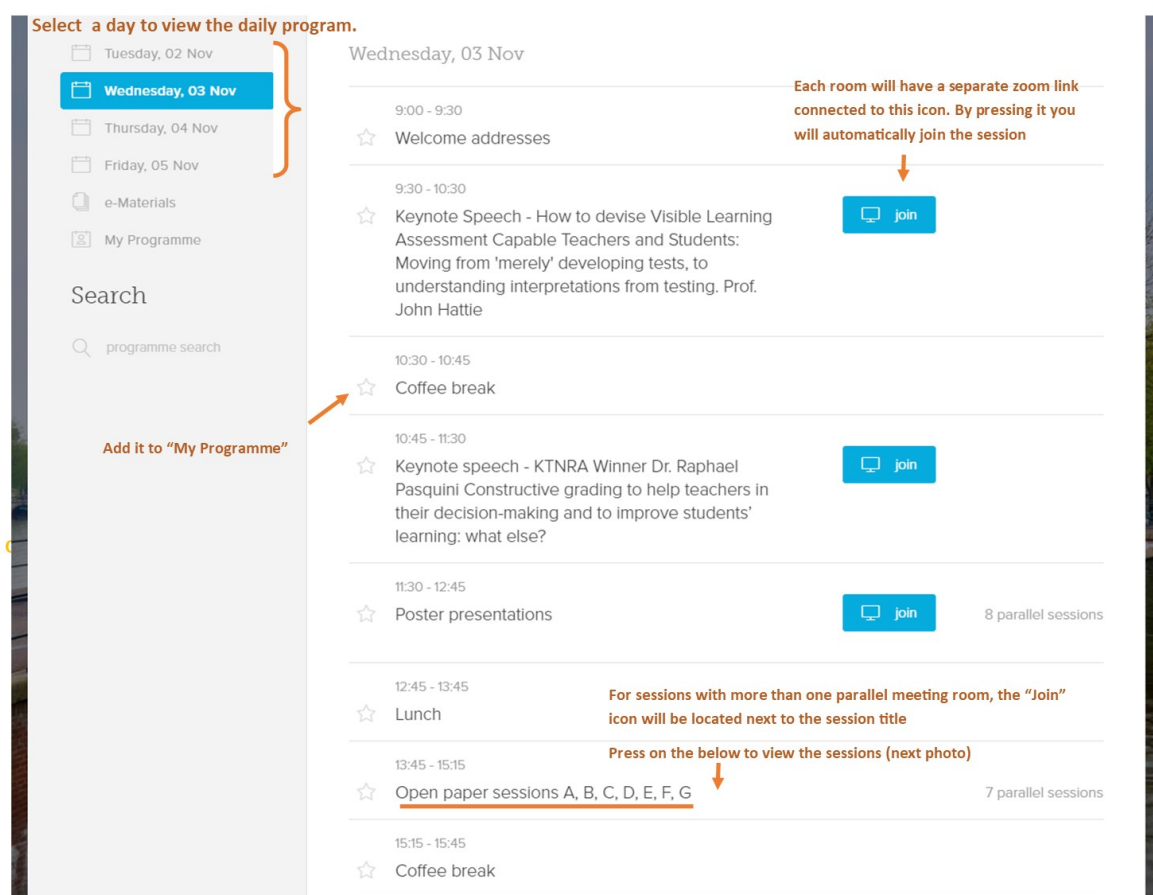
Note: Please check your Spam folder if you have not received the email within a few minutes.
